



Pupil Premium Spending 2016/17

The school receives £227,000 pupil premium funding

The school spends £189,089 of its pupil premium budget on staffing.

The school provides all class teachers half a day a fortnight out of class to work with vulnerable learners. The school employs three Deputy Headteachers who are responsible for the professional development of staff, ensuring that outstanding teaching and learning takes place in all classrooms. The school releases phase leaders to work directly with vulnerable learners pre-teaching and providing support where necessary.

The school spends £30,977 of its pupil premium budget on providing enhanced curriculum provision.

Analysis of school data shows that vulnerable learners at Rosendale who do not achieve age related expectations do so due to a lack of language. This might be because they are stage 3 EAL learners or that they do not have the richness of experience and therefore language that more confident learners have. The school employs a forest school teacher, a gardener and an artist in residence to provide exciting, stimulating and language rich experiences.

The school spends £17,946 of its pupil premium budget on therapeutic input.

Some of our most vulnerable learners have had difficult experiences in their lives which causes anxiety which acts as a barrier to learning. The school provides a drama therapist and an art therapist to work with those children in order to reduce their anxiety and enable them to learn.
