



## **Pupil Premium Spending 2017/18**

The school should receive £201,000 pupil premium funding

### **The school spends £116,935 of its pupil premium budget on staffing.**

The school has employed an additional Deputy Headteacher this year. The Deputy Headteachers have responsibility for the professional development of staff, standards, English and maths. These senior members of staff plan with year groups, observe impact of teaching and talk to children about their learning. They also release staff each week so that teachers can observe outstanding practice in other classrooms, discuss the impact of this teaching on learning and set targets in order to develop their own practice.

### **The school spends £31,952 of its pupil premium budget on providing enhanced curriculum provision.**

Analysis of school data shows that vulnerable learners at Rosendale who do not achieve age related expectations do so due to a lack of language. This might be because they are stage 3 EAL learners or that they do not have the richness of experience and therefore language that more confident learners have. The school employs a forest school teacher and EAL support staff member. We also fund trips, visits and school journey so that all children are able to participate.

### **The school spends £19,948 of its pupil premium budget on therapeutic input.**

Some of our most vulnerable learners have had difficult experiences in their lives which causes anxiety which acts as a barrier to learning. The school uses art and lego in a therapeutic way in order to reduce their anxiety and enable them to learn.

We have a £32,165 contingency set aside for intervention at the point of need.
